

## Religion: Memory and Innovation info letter

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### Short version

Best stop for the bus from Helsinki is University (U-hospital), or Yliopisto (TYKS U-sairaala) in Finnish.

Train stops in Kupittaa.

The main venue of the conference is Aurum at Henriksgatan 2 (Henrikinkatu 2). Registration and info table in lobby.

Summer School get-together on Sunday June 11<sup>th</sup> at 6pm will be in the round room of Theologicum (Biskopsgatan / Piispankatu 16)

### Arriving by bus (from Helsinki, or Helsinki-Vantaa airport)

The buses will drive by the venue before arriving at the Turku Bus Station, so if you are coming straight from the bus, we recommend getting off at the stop called "University (U-hospital)", Yliopisto (TYKS U-sairaala) in Finnish. After this, the next stop will be the Cathedral (Tuomiokirkko) which is the second-best option for finding our venue.

From the University bus stop, you should walk back a little towards where the bus came from. Before the small Hesburger there is a small street with stairs on your left. Take those stairs up to the University Hill, walk straight through the courtyard between the buildings and follow the road down to Henriksgatan/Henrikinkatu, and Aurum will be on your left. . It is about a 6 to 10 minutes' walk from the stop to our main venue.



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From the Cathedral stop, you need to walk around the cathedral until you find the Henriksgatan/Henrikinkatu. Follow the street and Aurum will be on your right. You will pass three roads on the right hand side before you get to Aurum. This is about 10 minutes or 600 m.

#### Arriving by train (from Helsinki)



The last stop for the train from Helsinki is Kupittaa (Turku). There are a couple of stairs leading up from the platforms, but you should take the ones that have a sign “Joukahaisenkatu/Tykistökatu” above. After climbing the stairs, turn left. There is a map suggesting a route to the University Hill. You can follow its suggestions, but there are some construction and renovation changes in street access. To avoid the construction, walk until you reach an intersection with Lemminkäisenkatu. There will be two

buildings on your left called BioCity and Pharmacy. Turn right onto Lemminkäisenkatu (you need to cross the street you’re on first) and follow the road past the big Hämeentie intersection and all the way to the stairs that take you up on the University Hill. Aurum is on the other side of the hill, so you just keep going straight all the way down to Henrikinkatu/Henriksgatan, and Aurum will be on your left. The walk is about 15 to 20 minutes, or 1.2 km.

#### Venue



Our main venue is in Aurum on Henriksgatan /Henrikinkatu 2. All the workshops, sessions, keynotes, lunches, and coffee breaks will be held here. The lecture halls (Rhodium and Palladium) and auditorium (Argentum) are conveniently located near the entrance and there are signs you can follow. All the Summer School workshops are scheduled to Rhodium, and the conference sessions are at either Rhodium, or Palladium, which are right next to each other.

Once you enter through the main doors, Rhodium and Palladium are to your left, past the janitor’s booth, and Argentum is accessed through the lobby one set of stairs up. The stairs are right in front of the front doors. The lunch is at the cafeteria to the right from the doors, and the coffee breaks will be in the bistro area of the café, next to the stairs. Except our last coffee break, which will be arranged in front of the Auditorium doors at 2<sup>nd</sup> floor.



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There will be a registration desk in the lobby area visible from the front doors. We wish you will all come in good time in the morning to get your name tags and get oriented, so we can stick to the schedule. You will also receive lunch tickets for each day, so do not lose those.

If no one is attending the registration desk, you can always call or text the secretary, Essi, on +358503468575 (Watsapp/phone), and there will be someone to help you. The doors of the venue remain unlocked until 2 pm, after which we hope there will be minimal amount of entering the building to avoid the hassle. If you absolutely need to pop out, make sure someone is available to let you in (wave through the glass doors). If no one is available, you can call or text the number above. It will be posted on the front doors too, just in case.

### [The Summer School informal get together \(optional\)](#)

The Summer School get-together will be in the round room of Theologicum on June 11<sup>th</sup> at 6 pm. Theologicum is located on Biskopsgatan / Piispankatu 16 right next to the Cathedral. You may access the courtyard via Biskopsgatan/ Piispankatu. It's the 1<sup>st</sup> one on your right when coming from the direction of the cathedral. Walk in through the opening and turn right. The door in is at the corner stairs. We will post signs for you to find it easier.

### [Summer school dinner](#)

The Summer School dinner is reserved for us on the June 12<sup>th</sup> at 6 pm in Arken's Kårkafé (Fabriksgatan / Tehtaankatu 2). Arken has a courtyard with a gate that should be open when you arrive. The main building at the back of the courtyard has glass doors which are locked but someone will be there to welcome you and guide you to the clothes storage (to the right from the doors) and the restaurant (left from the doors). If you can't see anyone and/or the gate is locked, please call the contact number. The food is vegetarian, and your special diets have been communicated to the catering.

You don't need to wear anything special for the dinner occasion. We will start quite soon after the last workshop of the day, so there is not much time for changing clothes.

Walking from the venue, cross the street and turn right, the road forks into Ryssänmäenrinne. Follow the path down until Tehtaankatu is on your left. Turn onto Tehtaankatu and follow it until you see our signs and the courtyard to Arken on your right. It is only about 5 minutes long walk, or 400 m.

### [Conference dinner](#)

The conference dinner is on June 14<sup>th</sup> at 6 pm on the restaurant boat, Svarte Rudolf. The address is Itäinen rantakatu 13. It is the second boat from the Aura bridge (on Aurakatu) walking away from the cathedral. The food is vegan and glutenfree, and the restaurant has your special diets.



There is an hour between the last keynote and the dinner, so you have a little time off and a pause to freshen up if you wish. To get to the boat from the venue, you may walk to the cathedral (left from the front doors of Aurum) and turn right to walk past the cathedral. Cross the road at the streetlights to your left and walk along the river until you have passed two more bridges on your right. Svarte Rudolf will be the 2<sup>nd</sup> boat after the 2<sup>nd</sup> bridge (3<sup>rd</sup> bridge after the cathedral). The name Svarte Rudolf is visible on the side of the black boat and there are signs at the entrance. It is about 15 to 20 minutes a walk, or 1,2 km.

### Excursion on June 13<sup>th</sup>

On the 13<sup>th</sup> of June we will take an esoteric walking tour with some guides. We begin the walk from the front yard of the Donner Institute (Donnerska Institutet on the map), Biskopsgatan/ Piispankatu 13 at 6 pm.

From Aurum, you cross the road, walk left and then right to Agricolankatu. At the next crossroads, cross the road and turn left onto Biskopsgatan/Piispankatu. The Donner Institute, or Humanisticum as it says on the gate, will soon be on your right. It's an orange stone building with a front garden. It's about 5 minutes from Aurum, or 300 m.

The tour will take about 45 minutes, so please wear comfortable shoes. More information about the tour: <https://esotericturku.wordpress.com/>
