

Upcoming events

Third African Forum for Doctoral Research in Human Rights (AfriDoors), Addis Ababa University, 7-11 October 2019

The second AfriDoors Forum will gather doctoral candidates, post docs and supervisors from the SHUREA partner institutions at the University of Nairobi 27-31 August 2018. The forum provides a platform for discussions and feedback on ongoing doctoral research and charts the way forward for continued cooperation among the partner institutions on capacity building in doctoral training in human rights.

SHUREA Reviewer's Workshop - Call for papers

The first SHUREA Reviewer's Workshop will take place 31 August - 1 September 2018 at the University of Nairobi. The Workshop pilots an informal peer review process for journal manuscripts within SHUREA. Researchers and doctoral candidates at the SHUREA universities are welcome to submit manuscripts to the review panel by 3 August 2018 at shurea@abo.fi. Only manuscripts for journal articles (max. 13 000 words) will be considered. In addition to providing personal details (name, contact information, position at SHUREA university), the researchers are requested to mention the name of the journal that they are targeting as well as to briefly explain the reason for this choice. Should the number of manuscripts submitted be high, a selection will be made taken into account the expertise of the members of the review panel, the quality of the manuscript and the publication plan. The authors, whose manuscripts

will be taken up for discussion in the Reviewer's Workshop, will receive written feedback on their manuscripts. The review panel will appoint from among its members a rapporteur for each manuscript.
